Blamires, Harry. *The Christian Mind: How Should a Christian Think?* Ann Arbor, Mich.: Servant, 1963.

One of the earliest books to deal with the subject of the Christian mind. A call for thinking Christianly about every area of life by developing a Christian world view.

Clark, Gordon H. *A Christian View of Men and Things*. Grand Rapids, Mich.: Eerdmans, 1951.



A Christian rationalist's presentation of how to think about life from a world view perspective. Although an older book, it still addresses many important issues for Christians to consider.

Geisler, Norman L., and William D. Watkins. *Worlds Apart: A Handbook on World Views*. Grand Rapids, Mich.: Baker, 1989.

Introduces and analyzes seven different world views: theism, atheism, pantheism, panentheism, deism, finite godism, and polytheism.

- Guinness, Os. *The Gravedigger File*. Downers Grove, Ill.: InterVarsity, 1983.
An engaging book written in the style of The Screwtape Letters. Explains and applies three sociological forces in our society: pluralization, secularization, and privatization.
- Holmes, Arthur F. *All Truth is God's Truth*. Grand Rapids, Mich.: Eerdmans, 1977.
Deals with the unbiblical dichotomy between sacred and secular dimensions of life. Shows how biblical Christianity provides the unity for all of life and every field of knowledge.
- Kuyper, Abraham. *Lectures on Calvinism*. Grand Rapids, Mich.: Eerdmans, 1931.
A classic exposition of Reformed theology applied to world views. More academic and esoteric than the other books listed.
- Schlossberg, Herbert. *Idols for Destruction*. Nashville, Tenn.: Thomas Nelson, 1983.
A lengthy and academic presentation of various ideas and philosophies that have had a devastating impact on American society. Shows how these ideologies have become idols in our society.
- Schlossberg, Herbert, and Marvin Olasky. *Turning Point: A Christian Worldview Declaration*. Westchester, Ill.: Crossway, 1987.
The introductory book in the Turning Point series published by Crossway Books and underwritten by the Fieldstead Institute. An exhortation for Christians to stand up for a Christian world view in society.
- Sire, James W. *The Universe Next Door*. 3d ed. Downers Grove, Ill.: InterVarsity, 1997.
Surveys and critiques various world views: theism, deism, naturalism, nihilism, existentialism, pantheism, the New Age, and postmodernism. One of the best books to have on your shelf.
